### **AARON'S ACRES MISSION**

Aaron's Acres provides individuals with disabilities ages 5 to 21 year-round therapeutically based age-appropriate recreational programs directed by specially trained and certified staff in a supportive environment that enhances socialization and communication skills. Emotional, educational, and recreational support is offered for the entire family.

# WHAT MAKES AARON'S ACRES UNIQUE?

- Supervisory staff comprised of professionals
- 1:1 or 1:2 staff to child ratio
- Nurse on staff at all times to address medical needs
- Everyone is included in all activities regardless of disabilities or challenges

#### The Aaron's Acres Community

Relationships...care...safety...hope...these are just a few of the things that families have shared with us about what our programming at Aaron's Acres has meant to them – and what you, our valued supporters and partners, have helped to make possible. Aaron's Acres started with a group of parents who wanted to create a camp program for their children with disabilities in Lancaster County – a community where children with all types of challenges were welcome. We are now providing year-round programming to children and young adults who come to us from seven counties in Pennsylvania.

Creating a more complete community for people of varying abilities continues to be our first priority and I am excited for you to read about our recent successes in this report. Our dream for the future is to continue to provide opportunities as well as expand the age of those we serve up to age 30, responding to requests from families whose children have graduated from high school and now have limited access to social and recreational activities.

Our dream is to also have a centralized facility that would house our programs, our administrative offices and our storage area. Having a place to call our home would mean that it would also be a home – a community – for our participants as well as their families! We are working towards these goals as part of an exciting collaborative effort with innovative local partners and we can't wait to tell you more in the coming months!

Our work is not possible without you. In order to continue on our journey and to provide more comprehensive programming in a dedicated space, we will continue to need your support. We look forward to the next 20+ years of building community – together!



# **WE ARE OPPORTUNITY**

For the summer of 2019, approximately 220 children and young adults experienced a camp program over a six-week period. Aaron's Acres offers AM and PM day camp sessions to younger children and older adolescents ages 5 to 21 during the summer months. Camp Sessions offer the opportunity to participate in music therapy, games, crafts, activities, swimming, therapeutic horseback riding, circle time and snack.

### **AARON'S ACRES ACTS OF KINDNESS (AAAOK)**





Young adults with disabilities ages 13 to 21 have the opportunity to engage in age-appropriate community service projects in AAAOK. Activities range from engaging with nursing home residents, to cleaning up local parks and trails, to lending help at homeless shelters. Our view is that when everyone participates, everyone benefits. For the summer of 2019, this group ran an Alex's Lemonade Stand, held a car wash (with donations benefiting a local non-profit agreed upon by participating campers), volunteered at LCBC Manheim, and assembled brown bag lunches for children living in Lancaster City through St. Anne's Church. One camper shared with his mother, "I am going to camp today and I am going to help someone".

#### Benefits of the AAAOK program include:

- Participants are given a sense of purpose and joy in their work
- A positive environment is built upon the values of giving back and making a difference
- Parents feel a sense of pride knowing their children can help others
- Organizations realize that our young adults can contribute in the community

Aaron's Acres offers adolescents ages 13 to 21 the opportunity to engage in age-appropriate community activities with their peers in Berks, Dauphin and Lancaster counties, once per month. Younger children ages 5 to 12 meet at Millersville University and have the opportunity to engage in recreational activities with their peers. Undergraduate students studying special education are accepted into an internship program with Aaron's Acres and have the opportunity to gain hands-on experience working with children who have varying abilities while being supervised by Aaron's Acres staff.



# **YOU ARE SUPPORT**


