IMPACT REPORT



When the 2019-2020 school year ended early for many of our participants, Aaron's Acres jumped into action. We wanted to create a sense of normalcy for those we support and a resource for the larger community, during a time when the "usual routine" for most was lost. We shared weekly video content from entertainers, performers, experts and trainers – some new to Aaron's Acres – to bring our children and families a time of music, fun, laugher, exercise, yoga, story time and more! We received a positive response from parents and their children and even learned that our families shared our content with Autistic support teachers and others within the local community.

Although the Aaron's Acres Team made the difficult decision to cancel 2020 summer camp for the health and safety of those we support, we did provide an exciting virtual summer camp experience – free of charge to registered families. We made it a priority to not only offer programming in whatever way possible, but also to pay staff and all performers, specialists and friends of Aaron's Acres who are participating in camp.

We are thankful to each family who encouraged us, each staff member who brainstormed **innovative** and new ideas, each donor who supported us, and each performer willing to share content with the children and young adults of Aaron's Acres.

Mission:

Aaron's Acres provides individuals with disabilities ages 5 to 21 year-round therapeutically based age-appropriate recreational programs directed by specially trained and certified staff in a supportive environment that enhances socialization and communication skills. Emotional, educational, and recreational support is offered for the entire family.

What makes us unique:

- Supervisory staff comprised of professionals
- 1:1 or 1:2 staff to child ratio
- Nurse on staff at all times to address medical needs
- Everyone is included in all activities regardless of disabilities or challenges

PROGRAM & OUTREACH



Virtual Summer Camp

Virtual summer camp was like nothing we have ever done before! Aaron's Acres held four 2-week sessions of camp via Zoom. Each session included a drive-by supply pick-up to kick off the session. Families were provided supplies needed for games, activities and crafts for the 2-week period. Participants enjoyed virtual visits from reptiles, horses and dogs, music and dancing sessions, games, activities and crafts. Parents and families were also offered access to virtual mind and body wellness yoga sessions.



Touch Points & Steinman Grant

A lot of things looked different in 2020, but one thing that did not was our commitment to the participants and families of Aaron's Acres. It was important to the Aaron's Acres Team that we check in with and remain connected to the members of our Aaron's Acres Family. Funds received from the Steinman Foundation allowed us to provide for the needs of our participants and families as they navigated the changes created by the pandemic. In the fall, the Aaron's Acres Admin Team hopped in the van and made personal surprise visits to every participant's home -- just to say "Hi!" and "We're thinking about you!"



School Year Program

The 2020 School Year Program was different from years past. Aaron's Acres offered adolescents and young adults ages 13-25 age-appropriate virtual programming October through December and was excited to expand this offering to young adults ages 22-25 for the year. Virtual Zoom sessions occurred monthly and included activities such as games, crafts, cooking, music and more. Based on feedback provided by parents of younger participants, Aaron's Acres offered younger children prerecorded videos from friends of Aaron's Acres. Videos included music, Aaron's Acres camp songs, reptiles, dancing and more.

REVENUE

As detailed in this financial overview. Aaron's Acres has a diverse revenue stream which is used responsibly to cover our expenses. The majority of Aaron's Acres funding is from our community. This support allows us to continue to provide programs to children and young adults with disabilities. Support comes from a wide variety of funders, including foundations, individual donors and businesses. This generosity also helps to build our scholarship program which ensures that all families are accepted; no family is ever turned away at Aaron's Acres.

*Fundraising revenue is generated from events, hosted by Aaron's Acres and community members. *Donation revenue is comprised of donations made directly to our organization.


Third Party Fundraisers \$23.1K

Community members and businesses think of Aaron's Acres when they wish to raise funds for local nonprofit organizations.


EXPENSES

During 2020, because of COVID, there was no inperson camp program and only 3 months of our school year component (before those programs were cancelled). As a result, the number of direct staff hours for 2020 as compared to 2019 were 560.5 and 13,833 respectively. Total expenses shifted due to less programming, resulting in a higher percentage in fundraising and administrative expenses, which is atypical for our organization. As we return to full capacity, our expectation is that these percentages will shift to pre-COVID status.


Revenues by Type

POSSIBILITY

For the past 23 years, Aaron's Acres has been committed to offering children and young adults with disabilities something that we all seek—possibility. The possibility to learn, to grow, and to thrive, despite any challenges. Our goal remains the same as it was when our organization was founded: to provide engaging programs that nurture socialization and communication skills.

Last year, our organization experienced something it had never been faced with before. As a result of the COVID-19 crisis, we had the opportunity to reimagine the format of our summer camp and school year programs. During a typical year of summer camp, children ride horses, participate in music therapy and even interact with reptiles. And during a typical year of our school year program, our participants would be creating crafts together and visiting various places in our community, such as the bowling alley and Hershey Park. While the delivery of these programs needed to shift to a virtual format last year, the positive impacts were still the same. We continued to provide our participants with vital personal connections and interactive experiences that helped them to flourish, despite the many difficulties they were facing as a result of the pandemic.

Throughout the unique and challenging time of the pandemic, our program team was there to support our participants and their families. We made phone calls to check in and offer assistance; we organized a caravan to deliver special treats to families, staff members and donors; we held drive-through supply pick-ups where we also celebrated our participants; we hosted two drive-in bingo events; and we offered video recordings of our sessions so that families could enjoy our programs together. We listened intently and responded in innovative ways to the needs expressed by the families we serve.

While most things changed last year, our commitment to our mission was unwavering. Thank you for helping us continue to provide familiar connections and transformative experiences for our participants through your support of Aaron's Acres!
